Reflection for 2nd Sunday of Lent

In the passage that precedes today's Gospel, Jesus lists the conditions that must be met by anyone who wants to be his disciple and follow him. These conditions are:



to accept the cross,
to desire to follow him,
to be ready to give one's life for Him.

Jesus speaks of these six days before his transfiguration. We don't know what happened in those few days. But these six days of retreat are not enough for Peter to accept Jesus' conditions. He proposes to set up tents, to stay on this mountain as if he wanted to say he will remain on this mountain, as if to say: Let us not go to the mountain of the cross (Golgotha). Peter, who had already been rebuked by Jesus once: "Get behind me, Satan! You hinder me because you do not think in God's way, but in human terms" (Mt 16:23), he continues to struggle to accept and live God's will completely. How well we understand Peter, how close he is to us. On this weakness Jesus built his Church.

Lord Jesus, you built your Church on Peter. Build also on me, make me the foundation of my family, parish community, religious community. So strong that the forces of evil will not destroy it. Amen.
