Reflection

"Though I walk in the valley of darkness, I will not fear evil, for You are with me!" (Ps 23:4). Jesus speaks to us in moments of darkness: in doubt, bitterness, fear and even sin, and perhaps especially then. He speaks to us when we are caught up in things that lead us into a dark valley. He always speaks, never stops. It is up to us whether we want to hear Him or turn our backs on Him. Maybe we have not responded to Jesus. Out of fear or shame. But even in the darkest moments of life, He repeats to us that we are important to Him, that our life has meaning, that we must be careful in the face of evil, but He is always close. Let us take to heart the words of Jesus in today's Gospel: If anyone denies me before men, I will also deny him before my Father who is in heaven.

Lord Jesus, avoiding the opportunity to bear witness to the faith is a sin. Do not turn your back on me, be by my side in times of trial, when I have to decide which side I am on. Forgive me for my cowardice. I love you. Amen.
