Reflection

The fourth Sunday of Easter is called Good Shepherd Sunday. Todays Gospel highlights that a good shepherd has unique qualities: he knows his sheep, sacrifices his life for them and gathers them into one fold.

The opposite of a shepherd is a hireling. He has nothing to do with the sheep, he is neither their owner nor their shepherd. Faced with the approaching danger, he runs

away because he does not care about the welfare of the sheep.

Jesus identifies himself with the good shepherd. We are the sheep, all the people for whom Jesus gives his life. His death on the cross, bringing salvation, is not the result of some necessity or accident, but is an act of self-sacrifice - it is true and complete love. This is the common will of the Father and the Son to bring everyone to salvation.

Lord Jesus, Good Shepherd, who knows me and loves me, despite my weakness and sins, I entrust myself to Your care.

Lead me wherever You want, I trust Your loving will. Amen.
