#### Reflection

As we listen to the Gospel for this Sunday, we are given guidance on the importance of having a living connection with Jesus. Jesus uses another very eloquent allegory, this time about the vine and branches to communicate to us. The Father is the one who cultivates the vine.

This would have been known to Jesus' listeners from their familiarity with the Old Testament (Isaiah 5). In Isaiah the vineyard was Israel, here the vine is Jesus. His disciples are twigs growing from a vine. The Father ensures that the branches bear fruit. Therefore, he performs two actions:

he cleanses those that bear fruit and cuts off those that do not bear fruit so that they do not burden the vine. A branch does not bear fruit if life-giving juices do not circulate in it.

The one who abides in Jesus, that is, is in a lasting relationship of living faith with Him, brings abundant fruit.

So every person has a choice: either to accept the teachings of Jesus and the principles of His Gospel and persevere in making his life fruitful, or to condemn themself allowing the death of life that God has given each person.

God's intention is for us to bear fruit through living communion with Jesus.

Father, I desire to be grafted onto the divine vine – Your Son Jesus. I want to take root in Him, draw from His grace, so that my life may be fruitful. Amen.
