Reflection The antidote to rejection and hatred in the world is the love of God, revealed in all its fullness in Jesus Christ. 'Taking responsibility for our Parish according to our means'

As we start a new financial year, it is a good time for me to reflect on the work we have achieved across our Parish in the last twelve months, and to express my gratitude for the generosity people continue to show in their giving. Whether through joining our community to pray at Mass; sharing your gifts through ministries in our Parish; living the Gospel through outreach in the wider community or your financial contribution. All of these gifts are essential to fulfilling our Mission as a community. It is also important at this time for me to focus on our priorities for the year ahead. Our mission is to sustain and nurture every element of our parish, including: the spiritual needs of our parishioners; our buildings; our school and supporting those that come to us in need.

Some of this work comes at significant financial cost, particularly the running, maintenance and restoration of our buildings.

We will have all seen increases in our personal utility bills or the cost of having maintenance work carried out, this is no different for our parish buildings. In most cases, worse because of the compliance and conditions we have to adhere to when having work done. This has resulted in a significant increase in our running costs over the last year. Unfortunately, our regular income has not been keeping up with these increases.

In our Parish we rely heavily on the income from legacies which have been invested through our central investment fund. While this income has remained stable, due to volatile market conditions, we have not seen it increase over the last number of years, so it is not keeping up with the inflation we are seeing in costs.

With this in mind, I would ask those who can, to please consider the following:

- Have your circumstances changed, perhaps you are now in a position to increase your regular giving?
- Are you now a tax payer? If so, please sign up to our Gift Aid, this will increase your giving by 25% straight away at no extra cost to you. Forms for this can be provided through the Parish office.
- Is leaving a legacy to our Parish something you have considered to help secure the Parish longer term?

Over the next few months our 2023-2024 accounts will be reviewed and approved by the Diocese finance department. We will then be in a position to provide the Parish with a copy of these accounts and hold our annual open Parish meeting. Details of this will be provided in the newsletter closer to the timed.
