Reflection

The exaltation of the bronze serpent in the desert, which we hear about in today's first reading, reminds us that we must contemplate the cause of our death. The paradox of the serpent lies precisely in this. It invites each of us to reflect with faith and trust in

God what causes our destruction, and a positive response followed by action to avoid what causes destruction, ensures that we will live. It is not the serpent that saves, but God who shows His power in the life of a person who trusts Him. The Cross of Jesus exposes: our inability to love God, ourselves, and our neighbours: and our rebellion against the call to change our lives, against the call to trust God more than ourselves. We do not agree with Jesus' diagnosis that the source of evil is our own heart - its when we agree, look at the Cross and receive the Grace that flows from It.



Jesus, grant me grace and strength, so that by contemplating Your cross, I may see what destroys me and that I may carry my cross, relying on Your love.
