Reflection for the week ahead: Israel had the only one temple and it was in Jerusalem. It was meant to be a sign of the presence of the one God. But even having a single temple, the people committed idolatry, paid homage to idols, creating in the temple a practice that displeased God. After the sign of the wedding, when God renews His marriage with His people (the wedding at Cana), Jesus fulfills another sign: the cleansing of the temple. He does this to point to the true worship that God desires, which is showing mercy and love, rather than focusing on the perfection of animal sacrifices. Therefore, Jesus reveals a new temple - His Body. In it, the sign of God's presence will be completed. Through its destruction (death) and rebuilding (resurrection), this new temple becomes a sign of God's presence.

In the superficiality of today's world, amidst the multitude of apparent signs of love. Lord, make my body also become a temple of Your presence.

Remembrance Our remembrance is of those who have died in two world wars, those who have died since, and those who die today through current conflict between nations. For some this time will still be personal, it will be hard, hurting, and lonely. Yet for others it will only be seen through images, stories told or handed down through family



generations, or seen through the media, and although devoid of personal contact, it will be equally disturbing.

Remembering the sacrifice made by so many, does not glorify war but recognises its cost, the human life lost and the suffering caused to all involved and affected by the actions taken. We also seek to re-commit ourselves before God to be those peacemakers and peacekeepers that Jesus asks all his disciples to become through the ways we live our lives together. We express our common humanity shared in the light of Christ pausing to recognise the value of every life, past and present.
