"The holy time of Advent is here; it seems to me that it is very especially the season of interior souls, those who live unceasingly and through everything wholly 'hidden with Christ in God' at the centre of themselves." (St Elizabeth of the Trinity)

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin."

In 1854, Pope Pius IX's solemn declaration, "Ineffabilis Deus," clarified with finality the long-held belief of the Church that Mary was conceived free from original sin. Mary was granted this extraordinary privilege because of Her unique role in history as the Mother of God.

That is, she received the gift of salvation in Christ from the very moment of her conception.

Bambinelli Sunday is a Catholic tradition where adults and children bring the "Baby Jesus" (bambinelli in Italian) figurines from their home Nativity scenes to church for a special blessing. The figure is then typically placed in the empty manger on Christmas eve or Christmas morning. The tradition helps to emphasize that Jesus is the true gift of Christmas and at the centre of the holiday. The tradition started in the mid-1900s at the Vatican. St. Pope John Paul II popularized it by encouraging children in Rome to bring their figurines to St. Peter's Square for a blessing during his Sunday Angelus address. **This blessing will take place at Masses in our Parish over the weekend 13th/14th December**.

Reflection

Happy New Year. With this Sunday we start a new liturgical year. We are again invited to live through all that God has done for us in history, and experience its power now. There is no ambiguity about this, St Paul writing to the Romans says: 'You know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep'.



At the beginning of Mass we will pray in our Collect (Opening Prayer) 'Grant your faithful (you and I), we pray almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ'. The readings for this Mass reinforce this message by these words 'awake from your sleep'; 'cast off the works of darkness and put on the armour of light'; 'put on the Lord Jesus Christ'; 'be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.' Advent is a time of active waiting for One who's arrival is certain. Jesus arrived in history as promised by God; He comes to us in every Mass in His fullness in Holy Communion and He will come in time.

How can you and I respond to these invitations? How can we 'resolve to run forth to meet our Christ'? If we live on our own, we can reflect and perhaps put a note on our fridge about the focus for our Advent - perhaps commit to reading the Word of God daily; perhaps make contact with someone we have lost contact with, perhaps go to a weekday Mass.

If you are a family, perhaps you could all sit down this pm and agree about commitments you are going to make as a family or each individual, write this out and put somewhere all can see - perhaps a curfew on mobiles and computers; have family meals together; read a book together; take turns to lead prayer.

Jesus is the One who will definitely appear on 25th December, He is the One who was born in a manger, Jesus is therefore not choosy but Jesus can't enter a heart which is closed to Him - Jesus is gentle not forceful.

'Resolve to run forth to meet your Christ', be brave, trust, the impact will be something for which you will be eternally grateful - guaranteed.
