Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the BVM

The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin."

In 1854, Pope Pius IX's solemn declaration, "Ineffabilis Deus," clarified with finality the long-held belief of the Church that Mary was conceived free from original sin. Mary was granted this extraordinary privilege because of Her unique role in history as the Mother of God. That is, she received the gift of salvation in Christ from the very moment of her conception.



What is a Solemnity'? Solemnities are the highest degree of liturgical celebrations and are usually reserved for the most important mysteries of faith. These include Easter, Pentecost and the Immaculate Conception; the principal titles of Our Lord, such as King and Sacred Heart; and celebrations that honour some saints of particular importance in salvation history, such as Ss. Peter and Paul, and St. John the Baptist on his day of birth.

Bambinelli Sunday is a Catholic tradition where adults and children bring the "Baby Jesus" (bambinelli in Italian) figurines from their home Nativity scenes to church for a special blessing. The figure is then typically placed in the empty manger on Christmas eve or Christmas morning. The tradition helps to emphasize that Jesus is the true gift of Christmas and at the centre of the holiday. The tradition started in the mid-1900s at the Vatican. St. Pope John Paul II popularized it by encouraging children in Rome to bring their figurines to St. Peter's Square for a blessing during his Sunday Angelus address - also at Masses in our Parish over the weekend 13th/14th December.


