### Epiphany of the Lord (This week 6th January)

"Epiphany" means "manifestation." It comes from Greek roots that mean "to show, to display" (*phainein*) and "on, to" (*epi*). An epiphany is therefore a time when something is shown, displayed, or manifested to an audience.

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Saviour of the world. the great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (*magi*) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee.

In the magi, representatives of the neighbouring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation.

The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations. Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus and worship him as Son of God and Saviour of the world only by turning towards the Jews and receiving from them the messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament. The Epiphany shows that "the full number of the nations" now takes its "place in the family of the patriarchs", and acquires *Israelitica dignitas* (is made "worthy of the heritage of Israel") [CCC 528].

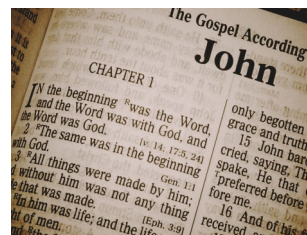
### 80 Club - Christmas Draw

### Reflection

Today's Gospel reading reminds us that our Beginning, middle, and end are with God.



This prompts the questions for all of us:

How do I start each day?

Do I start each day listening out to hear the Word of God?

In Isaiah 50:4 we read '*The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher,*

*that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word.*

*Morning by morning he wakens me - wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught.*'

There are people whose first thing when waking and last before falling asleep is reading a passage from the Holy Scriptures. In this way, they begin each day with God and end each day with the last Word being from Him. This practice shows an intentional approach to the relationship offered to us by God. There is evidence here of an understanding that life flows from reflecting on the Word of God. It's a practice that helps to remain in His presence every day. After all, it is not just about remembering God in the morning and evening, but about striving for continuous life with Him. *In Him, we live, move, and exist* (cf. Acts 17:28), which is why it is worth keeping the Word of God in our hearts, just as Mary did. Every time we think of reaching for our phone to access social media, or the like, if instead, we chose to look several times during the day at passages from the Scriptures, perhaps the one's of the 'Mass of the Day' readings, we will have the opportunity to continuously begin each moment with God.

*May His word always inspire all our thoughts and actions.*

*Jesus! You are the Word of God! I want to reflect in my heart as often as possible on what You say to me.*

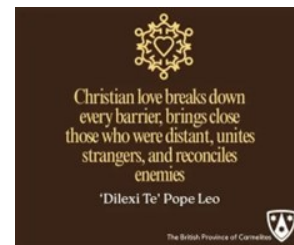
