Soft and alcoholic drinks and tea and coffee will also be available.


Dilexi Te – The Burning Heart of the Church's Mission A day of reflection with Bishop Nicholas Hudson

Reflection

Have you ever asked yourself why Christmas, in the Catholic Church, ends with the Solemnity of 'The Baptism of the Lord'? The celebration of this Solemnity predates the celebration of Epiphany and the celebration of Christmas. In the 2nd century, Gnosticism (*rejection of all matter, including human body, as the domain of evil and hence Jesus could not be God at birth as He took on a human body*) started to pervade some parts of Christianity. These believers started celebrating the vigil of the Baptism of Jesus (5th January eve) to emphasise that Jesus became God only when Baptised by John the Baptist. Their point of reference was the words of the synoptic Gospels 'a voice came from the heavens, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." (Mt 3:17). They disregarded the earlier part of the Gospel when John says 'Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptised by him. John tried to prevent him, saying, "I need to be baptised by you, and yet you are coming to me?"' (Mt 3:13-14). Also they either didn't have, or disregarded, Johns Gospel (J 1: 1-4; 6- 17); which clearly states that Jesus existed always as God and with God 'born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision but of God.' (J 1:13). So the celebration of Epiphany and much later Christmas started being celebrated to emphasise the Revelation and Truth that in Mary's womb Jesus took on a human body and had two natures completely and at the same time - fully Divine and fully human.

In receiving the Sacrament of Baptism we are invited to share in Divine life fully - 'From his fullness we have all received, grace in place of grace, because while the law was given through Moses, grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. (J 1:16-17).

This is the extent of the limitless generosity of God - do I realise what God is offering me ('grace in place of grace') in Baptism and all the Sacraments - how am I responding?
