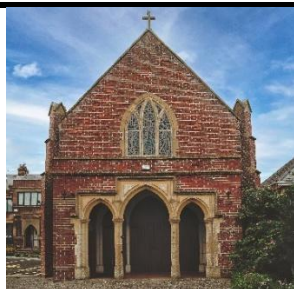

Fr James' Installation as Parish Priest – Friday 6th March, 5.00pm - St Mary's, Axminster

Bishop Nicholas is coming to install Fr James as the Parish Priest on Friday 6th March at 5.00pm. After the Installation Mass, please join us and the Bishop in the school hall for refreshments and food. Please take this opportunity to pray with the Bishop for our new Parish Priest, and to be one of the first parishes to meet the Bishop in person.

Who is this priest?

A couple of weeks ago I said that I come from Plymouth and that my last parish was West Moors, Dorset as well as being chaplain to St Edward's Secondary School. This week it is time to share with you that I am a convert. In the back streets of Stonehouse, Plymouth, I experienced a spontaneous conversion at aged 16 during which I was also called to the priesthood. This eventually led to my baptism at the hands of Bishop Christopher at the Cathedral aged 17. He encouraged my discernment, though being a fresh convert meant I had to take time before applying to the Diocese. After a year studying long-distance with the Maryvale Institute, I then studied theology at Heythrop College, London where I applied to

seminary in the final year of studies and was accepted by the Diocese of Westminster. More to come next week!

Items needed:

cereal, soup, rice pudding, long-life milk, tins fruit, mixed veg carrots, peas, potatoes, pasta, rice, tomatoes, beans, tinned meats, tea bags, coffee, jam, biscuits, long-life milk, washing powder, washing up liquid, shampoo, shower gel.

Seaton Foodbank

Items needed: Packets of savoury rice, toilet rolls, tins of meatballs, hot dogs, Chilli con Carne, chicken curry, Irish stew, Fray Bentos pies, ravioli, tins of corned beef and spam, medium size detergents (non-bio if possible).

Lyme Regis Foodbank

Items needed: Any non-perishable and in-date food items such as tinned soup, rice pudding, custard, fruit, tinned veg, tomatoes, beans, tinned meats, sandwich spreads, pasta, tea bags, coffee, jam, biscuits, long-life milk, washing powder/liquid, washing up liquid, toilet rolls, shampoo, shower gel.
